

## Where is the world's population distributed?


- Two thirds of the world's inhabitants live in four regions:
  - East Asia
  - South Asia
  - Southeast Asia
  - Europe
- People tend to live in <u>temperate</u> areas with <u>fertile soil</u>, near bodies of water
  - Areas that are permanently inhabited by humans are called the ecumene
- People tend to avoid lands that are
  - Dry
  - Wet
  - Cold
  - High Altitudes

## Why is global population increasing?

- Statistics used by <u>demographers</u> to study population growth: (MUST KNOW!!!)
  - Crude Birth Rate (CBR): Total number of live births per year, per 1,000 people in the population
  - Crude Death Rate (CDR): Total number of deaths per year, per 1,000 people in the population
  - Natural Increase Rate (NIR): Percentage by which a population grows in a year



**Doubling Time:** 

Amount of time it would take for the population to double, assuming that the NIR is maintained
