

Judaism

- ► First developed monotheistic religion
 - ► Founded by Abraham around 1200 B.C.E.
 - Covenant with God
- ► What do they believe?
 - ► There is one God, usually called Yahweh or Adonai
 - Sacred text= the Torah (first 5 books of their bible) and the Hebrew Bible
 - ► Follow the Ten Commandments
 - ▶ Israel is holy land
 - ► Many "diasporas" through history
 - ▶ Believe in afterlife




Hinduism

- ► Has no founder
- Sacred texts include Vedas and Upanishads
- Very diverse
 - ► Inclusive of all religions
- Polytheistic
 - ▶ Believe in one supreme god, as well as many gods and goddesses, which vary by region and practice.
- Major goal= Moksha
 - Becoming one with the supreme god, achieved through reincarnation (samsara) and fulfillment of Dharma (duty)
- No concept of afterlife, just being at peace with the supreme god.



Hindu Caste System




Buddhism



- Branched off of Hinduism
- Developed in India (Nepal)by the teachings of the first "Buddha," Siddhartha Gautama.
- Beliefs are closely aligned with Hinduism, with more focus on oneself
 - ► No emphasis on gods
 - ► Rejects caste system
- ▶ Goal= Nirvana (very similar to Moksha)
 - Ultimate wisdom and being at one with the universe.
- Buddhism developed from a philosophy into a religion gradually as it spread to new regions- particularly China. (Mahayana)

Christianity



- Branched off of Judaism, so many similar beliefs
 - Monotheistic
 - Holy text- Bible (Old and New Testament)
- Largest religion in the world with many denominations
- Developed from the teachings of Jesus of Nazareth- spread by Paul of Tarsus
 - Believed to be the son of God- the Savior or Messiah
 - Tried and crucified by the Romans
 - Resurrected from the dead
 - Afterlife of either Heaven or Hell
 - Heaven is achieved through acceptance of Jesus as a savior, prayer, and various customs depending on practice.

Islam

- A new religion, Islam, developed in 610 C.E.
 - ► Founder/ Prophet Muhammad
 - Arabian Peninsula- Mecca
 - Spread message of monotheism, offended his polytheistic tribe members
 - ► Left to Medina for safety but returned to Mecca later (inspired the Hajj)
 - ▶ Smashed the idols of the Kaaba, which is now a holy site
- At this point, Muhammad had thousands of followers and was experienced as a military and political leader
 - Islam was an "Empire of Faith," meaning that religion and politics were closely aligned





Foundations of Islam

- ► Holy text- Quran
 - Secondary religious text is called the Hadiths
- Centered on very strict monotheism
 - ► Has many of the same foundational beliefs of Judaism and Christianity, since they are all Abrahamic faiths
- Emphasis on the "Five Pillars of Faith"
- Islam spread very quickly because of the appeal of
 - ► Equality (women, poor, orphans, etc.)
 - ► Political Unity
 - ► Moral Code
